They all did well and represented our Association very well.

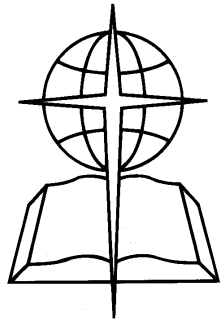


SEMINARY EXTENSION

The Seminary Extension at McMinn-Meigs Baptist Center continues to advance through a combination of traditional classroom instruction and the integration of technological platforms such as electronic classroom systems, Facebook Live, and ZOOM meetings to facilitate ongoing education. God has truly blessed our efforts, and our students have demonstrated strong performance both academically and spiritually. This year, they have successfully completed the following courses: During the *Winter Session*, students completed the “New Testament Survey Part II,” utilizing Thomas D. Lea & David Alan Black’s *New Testament, Its Background and Message, 2nd Edition*. This course has provided a comprehensive overview of all New Testament epistles, spanning from Romans through Revelation. The curriculum encompassed the general epistles attributed to the apostle Paul, his pastoral letters, as well as other general epistles. During the *Summer Session*, students successfully completed the “Contemporary Preaching” course utilizing Wayne McDill’s texts, *The 12 Essential Skills for Great Preaching* and *The Moment of Truth*. This course provided an in-depth examination of the function of preaching and the responsibilities of the preacher, as well as the scope, intent, organization, and delivery of sermons. Focus was also placed on effective short- and long-term sermon planning. The capstone for this course tasked each student with planning, researching, developing, and presenting a sermon based on an assigned passage. During the current *Fall Session*, students are engaged in completing “Contemporary World Religions,” utilizing George W. Braswell, Jr.’s *Understanding World Religions, Revised* and *Understanding Sectarian Groups in America, Revised*. This course offers a comprehensive overview of major world religions and their core tenets, encompassing Hinduism, Taoism, Confucianism, Judaism, and Islam. Additionally, it examines prominent sectarian groups within the United States, including Mormons, Jehovah’s Witnesses, the Unification Church, the Occult,

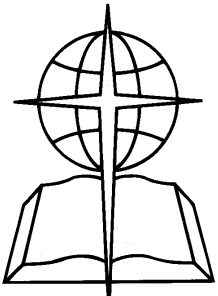

CHRISTIAN BUILDERS OF SOUTHEAST TENNESSEE

Allen Gentry, Christian Builders Director

It's been my pleasure to work with the volunteers and homeowners in our association over the last year. Since October of 2024, 25 ramps have been completed. We have two that are approved and ready to schedule, five that are pending completion of the project plan, and 5 to be evaluated. To date almost 500 volunteer hours have been contributed to the planning, preparation, and completion of these projects. We experienced about a three month delay due to grant funds being held up for reauthorization. Funds became available again in August. In October we began what we hope will be an on-going collaboration with the local Habitat for Humanity affiliate. Habitat has expanded its scope to include home repair projects. Habitat had identified two projects where ramp construction was needed and contacted MNCB for assistance. Our collaboration included MNCB planning the ramp project, providing our volunteer labor and equipment, as well as some materials. HFH and the homeowner provided funds for the materials as well as volunteer workers. Another project is pending evaluation in Meigs County. MNCB purchased a used enclosed trailer to replace the weary and aging trailer. The trailer was renovated by the McMinn County HS CTE department. It was pressure washed and repainted. Tail and signal lights were replaced. The interior was redesigned and equipment transferred over to it. MNCB account balance as of 10/1/25 is \$10,582. Donations and contributions from individuals and churches are still welcomed. This is the time of year to add Christian Builders to your missions' budgets. We do not receive funding as a part of the McMinn-Meigs Baptists Association budget. We can always use more volunteers. A lot of our folks are older, and the same ones come time and time again to the jobs. We are not getting any younger. There were several days that we opted not to work due to the heat and humidity. There are a variety of tasks available on every project. Tasks include moving material, using hand tools, unloading and loading the trailer, cleanup, handing out water, and just generally keeping a watchful eye for signs of fatigue.

Lastly, please keep all of our clients, past, current and future in your prayers. Many times as I go to interview these people, they are dealing with medical issues, in pain, and depressed. Some tell me they used to go to church, but now due to their disability, they can't. The ramps at least improve their ability to get in and out of their homes. They need our churches to reach out to them. They are your neighbors.

It is hard to believe how fast this year progressed. There has been a lot happening in the different churches and we are seeing God move in a great way throughout the Association.

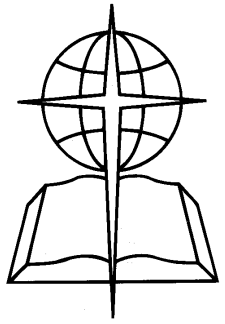

Tennessee Baptist Adult Homes now has a ministry in west Tennessee!! In March of this year, we moved our first residents into the first four duplex apartments at the new Baptist Village Humboldt! The apartments were filled within the first month of opening and there are others who would move in if we had more. We are so excited that this ministry is up and going. You may recall that there was the possibility that we might have to liquidate the Humboldt project due to the financial strains of our group home ministry. God has provided! It is our belief He will continue to do so. As funds allow, we will build more duplexes at Humboldt. When the entire Baptist Village Humboldt project is completed, there will be 10 duplexes serving 20 financially needy retired pastors and missionaries.

Regarding the financial issues mentioned above, we have downsized our group home ministry by closing one of the homes and reducing our resident capacity from 55 to 47. The downsizing has resulted in cost savings of around \$200,000. Our increased Father's Day Offering in 2024 coupled with the generous allocation increase or Cooperative Program funds (about \$117,000) are even more examples of God's provision! What an exciting time for the ministry of TBAH. We believe that 4 homes with a capacity of 47 is the right size for this ministry. We fell to as few as 43 residents earlier this year, but the current census is 45. I am so glad our homes are here for the families who have loved and cared for their family members and are no longer able to provide that care.

It is our hope and belief that this downsizing has made us "right sized" and that there will not be need for further downsizing. Our Father's Day Offering is one way, and our best way, to eliminate further cuts to our ministry. As of July 24th, receipts through the 2025 Father's Day Offering are about \$20,000 ahead of last year. You may recall that last year we set a record of \$547,000! This year's goal is \$575,000. If we can stay \$20,000 ahead of last year's

TENNESSEE BAPTIST CHILDREN'S HOMES

Tennessee Baptist Children's Homes has been welcoming children in hard places with the love of Christ for 134 years! Because of the faithfulness of churches, businesses and individuals who have a heart for children and families who are struggling, we have been able to serve over 237 children and their families over the past year. Thank you for your prayers, for your service, and for sharing your financial resources with TBCH. Our ministry operates without the use of government funds. We have chosen to rely on God's provision through His people to supply the resources necessary to meet the needs of the children and families we serve. TBCH serves children through two programs. Our **Foster Care** program allows us to place children who are in the state's custody into homes where Jesus is loved and served and where children will have this godly influence in their lives for however long they reside in that home. Our foster care team and volunteers span from Memphis to Kingsport. The other program for providing gospel centered care is our **Residential Care** program. Our campuses in Brentwood, Chattanooga and Millington are all in the process of exciting changes related to our Firm Foundations Project. We are currently in construction mode on each of our three campuses to provide individual bedrooms and baths for each resident. Because of what many of our children have experienced or been exposed to, this need becomes more apparent as each year passes. TBCH is making sacrifices to bring this "**Firm Foundations Project**" vision into reality. We are reducing the size of our campuses without reducing the number of children we serve. The liquidation of selected properties will help us complete Phase One of the Firm Foundations Project on each campus. While liquidated property is helping us put our plans into action we are still in great need of your financial assistance. Thank you to those of you whose church gives faithfully to the Cooperative Program and also makes a direct gift to TBCH through the Mother's Day Offering or through your annual missions offerings!

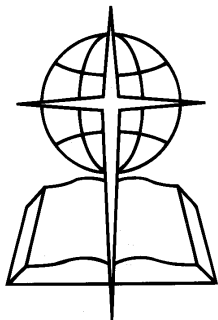

Tennessee Woman's Missionary Union (TN WMU) encourages and equips churches and individuals to engage in missions learning and involvement that enables them to fulfill the Great Commission. This report shares information about some of the state events, ministries, and initiatives that have taken place.

Christian Job Corps (CJC) is a ministry of WMU that seeks to help men and women break the cycle of poverty through job and life skill classes, Bible study, and mentoring. There are 16 Tennessee CJC sites in 14 locations. In their 2025 annual ministry reports, these sites reported 784 participants in their various programs, nine decisions for Christ, and 417 volunteers serving 13,717 volunteer hours.

TN WMU's missionary care ministries are supported through funds from the Missions for Life Fund and the Golden Offering for Tennessee Missions (GOTM).

Missionary Parents Fellowship (MPF): On September 28, 2024, 13 parents of International Mission Board (IMB) missionaries gathered via Zoom for a time of fellowship, information, prayer, and encouragement. TN WMU supports the Tennessee MPF by maintaining its database, distributing communication/promotion materials, and helping to coordinate and host the annual state retreat. The 2024 retreat was canceled due to flooding in Tennessee and was rescheduled as a Zoom meeting.

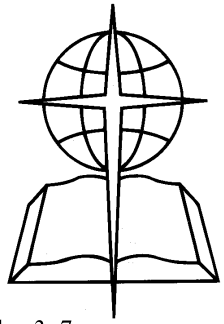
Encourage Collegiate MKs: Each year TN WMU assigns a Missionary Kid (MK) who attends college in Tennessee to every association so churches can encourage them. Thirteen MKs were assigned to associations for the 2024-2025 school year.

Former Missionary Fellowships: Former missionaries in West, Middle, and East TN gather several times each year for fellowship, connection, and encouragement. TN WMU provides funds for meals during these gatherings.

Christmas Gifts: In December 2024, TN WMU sent gifts to missionary kids and retired missionaries. A \$150 gift was sent to 13 MKs whose parents serve with IMB and are from Tennessee, and a \$50 gift was sent to 69 retired

WMU and the IMB, from July 28 to August 2, 2025.

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TENNESSEE WOMAN'S MISSIONARY UNION

As part of the prayer advocacy partnership with Denver, TN WMU sent a mission team of six women to Denver from October 3- 7, 2024. The team met with nine church planters and prayed for them, their ministries, families, and the communities around the churches. TN WMU has sent nine teams to serve in Denver over the past eight years, meeting with more than 30 church planters to pray and serve their communities.

The 2024 Connection was held at Tennessee Tech University's Baptist Collegiate Ministry on September 13- 15, 2024, where 132 youth girls and leaders representing 15 churches attended. The event featured Bible study leader Leslie Hudson and 1MB missionary speaker Angela Stoda.

RA Camp-o-Ree was held on October 18 - 20, 2024, at Linden Valley Baptist Conference Center with over 400 boys, leaders, and personnel in attendance. Boys participated in a multitude of activities, challenges, and crafts while enjoying the great outdoors, meeting missionaries, and attending two action-packed worship services. This missions camping event for boys in grades 1- 12 is hosted by Mid-South Royal Ambassadors and TN WMU.

Over 60 people attended the WMU Gathering at Summit on Sunday, November 10, at Northside Baptist Church, Murfreesboro. TN WMU, Concord Baptist Association WMU, and Northside Baptist Church partnered together to host this time of fellowship and inspiration.

The 2025 Missions Get-Together was held at First Baptist Church, Dickson, on April 4- 5, with a total attendance of 512 people representing over 130 churches. Participants attended four general sessions and five breakout sessions and connected with over 30 missions and ministry leaders. Participants donated over 9,000 items, \$60 in cash, and \$1,100 in gift cards for Pregnancy Resource Centers across the state through the event's ministry project. An additional \$13,005 was given through the event's missions offering, benefiting the Amy Hood Adoption Endowment (90%) and the TN WMU Tennessee N Touch Endowment (10%).

The 2025 TN WMU Annual Meeting occurred on April 5 during the Saturday morning general session of Missions Get-Together. The meeting included highlights of the work of TN WMU and the election of 2025-2026 state officers and new Executive Board Members.

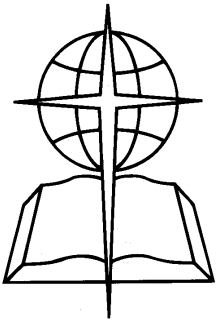
TN WMU awarded \$36,600 in scholarships to 39 students attending graduate school, seminary, and undergraduate school in Tennessee for the 2025- 2026 school year. These scholarships are funded through endowments, invested funds, and the GOTM. In 2025, TN WMU collaborated with churches, associations, and other ministries to host over 15 adult and youth Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) training events across the state, as part of our emphasis on addressing the critical issue of mental health. MHFA is a skills-based training that teaches participants to identify, understand, and respond to mental health and substance use challenges.

The 2024-2025 Tennessee Missions Emphasis theme was "All Things Tennessee," with a GOTM goal of \$2,700,000. As of July 25, 2025, the total amount was \$2,462,461. The offering year goes from September 1 to August 31.

BAPTIST MEMORIAL HEALTH CARE SYSTEM MEMPHIS, TENNESSEE

Baptist Memorial Health Care began as a 150-bed hospital in downtown Memphis in 1912. It was formed by the Southern Baptist Conventions of Tennessee, Mississippi and Arkansas because they recognized a tremendous need for a health care facility in this part of the country. The hospital eventually grew to become the largest private hospital in the world.

The Baptist Memorial Health Care system was created in 1981 to provide an integrated health care delivery system offering a full continuum of care to communities throughout the Mid-South. Today, a total of 24 hospitals in Arkansas, Tennessee and Mississippi; an 1,100-member physician group; and dozens of other entities are affiliated with Baptist.

Baptist Memorial Health Care's staff chaplains are a part of the health care team. Patients, family members and employees know they can ask for a chaplain at any time to augment our health care with spiritual or emotional care.

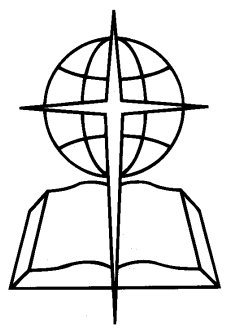
For the past eight years, Baptist's Pastoral Care Department has hosted The Rev. Jimmy Terry Preaching Series. The series, named in memory of a beloved member of Baptist's Board of Trustees and the founder of Tabernacle Baptist Church in Clarksville, Tennessee, welcomes a speaker each month to deliver an evangelical message from Baptist's flagship hospital. Video recordings of each event are posted on our Facebook page. They have been viewed more than 182,000 times and have reached 124,000 people in the past year.

Baptist Memorial Health Care received state approval to build a new community hospital in Fayette County. The facility will serve West Tennessee along the I-40 corridor between Arlington and Jackson, near Blue-Oval City, Ford's automotive manufacturing ecosystem. The hospital will include eight emergency rooms, eight acute care inpatient beds, outpatient imaging and lab services.

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services awarded Baptist Carroll County, Baptist Tipton and Baptist Union City four stars (out of five) for quality. The ratings are based on 46 quality measurements from five categories: mortality, safety of care, readmission, patient experience, and timely and effective care.

Baptist Carroll County and Baptist Union City earned "A" Leapfrog Hospital Safety Grades in fall 2024 and spring 2025. Baptist Carroll County has earned five consecutive "A" grades, and Baptist Union City earned four consecutive "A" grades.

Several Baptist Memorial Hospitals earned Tennessee Hospital Association Zero Harm Awards for their infection prevention achievements. Baptist Carroll County and Baptist Tipton were two of only eight hospitals in the state to be recognized for zero harm events in four categories. THA also recognized Baptist Collierville, Baptist Women's Hospital, Baptist Memphis and Baptist Union City for not having infections in specific departments.



HARRISON-CHILHOWEE BAPTIST ACADEMY DBA THE KING'S ACADEMY

Since 1880, Harrison-Chilhowee Baptist Academy has been serving East Tennessee and the world as a distinctively Christian school. For more than 30 years, Tennessee Baptists' accredited Christian boarding and day school has operated under the name of The King's Academy. Located in Seymour, TN, at the foothills of the Great Smoky Mountains, TKA continues to reach students locally and globally.

This past summer has been a season of transition, but God's provision and faithfulness have been evident at every step. Even through uncertainty, we have seen His hand clearly at work—raising up new leaders, opening doors for ministry, and reinforcing the truth that this school belongs to Him.

Here are some of the ways God has been at work at TKA this year:

- **Residence Life Program:** We anticipate serving 31 international students representing 17 countries.

This diversity continues to enrich our Christ-centered, global community.

- **Shen Science Center:** After years of prayer and planning, construction has begun on the Shen Science Center. This facility will strengthen our academic program, particularly for students seeking STEM careers, and expand our reach among international families.

- **Spiritual Life: Chapel Theme "Known":** This year's chapel focus is built on John 10:14—"I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me." In the fall, students will study the Gospel of John. In the spring, the life of David. Our goal is for every student to know they are seen, known, and loved by God.

- **Education Freedom Scholarship:** Over 100 students applied and enrolled at TKA through Tennessee's EFS program, reflecting both the need and the effectiveness of our outreach to local families.

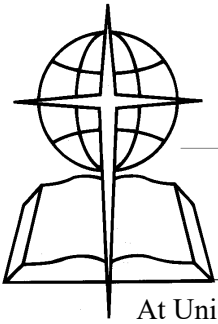
- **Library Renovation:** The school library received a full refresh with new carpet, paint, and a new Middle School Writing Lab. This space now better serves our growing student body.

- **Campus Security Enhancements:** All campus security cameras are in the process of being upgraded, and a new DVR system was installed to provide higher-quality footage. Student safety remains a priority.

- **Dual Enrollment Partnership:** TKA launched a new partnership with Carson-Newman University offering on-campus dual enrollment classes in College Algebra and Composition. This allows students to earn college credit in a Christ-centered learning environment with trusted faculty.

- **Elementary Enrollment Growth:** Several elementary grades now have waiting pools, reflecting strong interest from local families and continued enrollment momentum.

- **Projected Enrollment:** Based on current applications, enrollment is on pace to surpass our budgeted goal of 415 students, potentially reaching 430 this fall. Through every challenge, God has reminded us that He is in control. We step into this school year with peace, not because we know the future, but because we trust the One who does. Thank you for your continued support, encouragement, and prayers. We are honored to be part of the Tennessee Baptist family and remain committed to raising up students who live out their faith with courage and purpose.



UNION UNIVERSITY

At Union University, our vital partnership with Tennessee Baptists continues to shape our mission. As we reflect on the past year, we are reminded that our work is anchored in these core values: **Excellence-Driven, Christ-Centered, People-Focused, and Future-Directed.**



Consistent with the Tennessee Baptist Mission Board’s strategic priorities — **strengthening and multiplying Gospel leaders, evangelistic disciples, and healthy churches** — Union has worked intentionally to connect students with ministry opportunities:

- The first TBMB ministry pipeline internship has been developed by Josh Franks in partnership with Union and area pastors. Beginning in the spring of 2026, students will serve in local churches, earn academic credit, and receive support from the TBMB, which plans to replicate this model across the state.
- At the request of TBMB, Union developed and taught its first class on church planting this past spring. Twenty-one students participated.

Union hosted its second ministry fair this year, connecting students with local churches and ministries for internships and summer service.

Selected Highlights from the Past Year

- In March, we opened and dedicated **The Ethos Forum**, a new academic facility for the McAfee School of Business and our computer science and engineering programs.
- Our comprehensive fundraising campaign, “**Union 200: Tradition. Truth. Transformation.**” is progressing, with just over \$52 million given and pledged toward the \$80 million goal. Our next major project is a new chapel at the heart of campus — a space for worship, training, and sending out Gospel leaders.

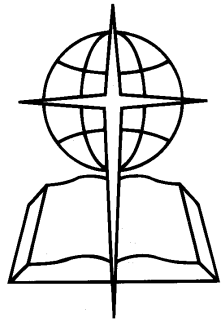

- In March, hundreds of volunteers at Union participated in a six-day public reading of the entire Bible under Miller Tower as part of the 2025 Spring Bible Conference. As Isaiah 40:8 reminds us: “**The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever.**”

Union women’s basketball coach Mark Campbell, who leads with Christ-centered excellence, was inducted into the Women’s Basketball Hall of Fame in June.

We welcomed students from 44 states and 55 countries for the 2024-25 academic year.

At the start of the 2024-25 academic year, we launched the public phase of the largest comprehensive campaign in our history. Entitled "Legacy," the \$73 million phase of this initiative includes new academic programs, campus buildings and student recreation.

C-N is already enjoying fruits grown out of the Legacy campaign. Last fall, we held two ribbon cuttings in one day, opening the 110,000 square-foot West Campus Commons residence hall and a new student Recreation Park, featuring: softball field, soccer pitch, and basketball, beach volleyball, pickleball courts. A new Child Development Lab opens this fall on the western perimeter of campus.

The campaign has opened doors to new academic offerings: Master of Divinity, MBA in Entrepreneurial Leadership, Master of Accountancy and Business in Analytics. Degree programs in Homeland Security and Emergency Management, Artificial Intelligence in Business, and Hospitality and Tourism Management launched this fall. A Doctor of Nursing Anesthesia Practice launches Jan. 2026. Each offering is rigorous while being taught with a biblical worldview.

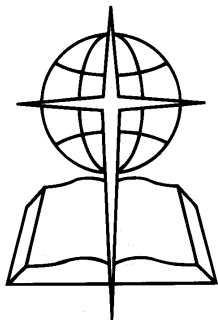
Last fall we celebrated with 31 members of our Eagles football team who made public professions of faith by being baptized in Mossy Creek. This is the most we have ever had and demonstrates how the Spirit is moving on campus in mighty ways.

For 2024-25, chapel on Tuesday and Thursday had an average attendance of 415 students (a 6% increase from the previous year.)

C-N's Serve Day last year saw over 600 students take part in outreach at some 40 project sites across multiple counties. Students also packed 11,000 meals to be distributed to help feed those in need.

In 2024, Appalachian Ministries of the Smokies (AMOS) celebrated 40 years of ministry. When the year had concluded, AMOS' Ministry Center had served 1,358 families and 3,339 individuals. The Home Repair Ministry completed 30 projects across four counties, while Samaritan House served 32 homeless families and provided 8,595 meals to those in need.

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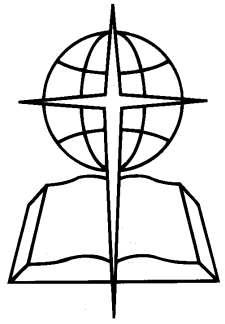

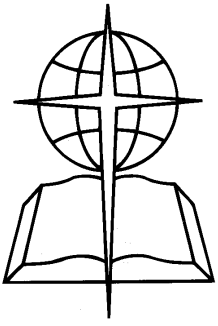

What is a Baptist Association?

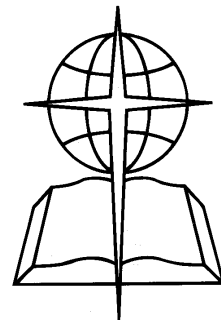
(An Association is what the churches make it.)

A Baptist Association is a self-governing fellowship of autonomous churches sharing a common faith and active on mission in their setting.

1. The churches of an association are free, independent, self-governing, autonomous churches that decide to associate themselves to do certain things together.
2. The fellowship of churches involves oneness, shared life, mutuality and koinonia. It is a “family” of churches and a network, in which churches give and receive assistance. The association as a fellowship emphasizes the relationship existing among the churches.
3. Sharing a common faith - The fellowship of an association is grounded in harmony in faith and practice. Associations differ in regard to the particular doctrinal issues that are important to their fellowship and in regard to the amount of diversity encouraged or tolerated on those issues. Nevertheless, the association, unlike state conventions, is a doctrinally based fellowship.
4. Active on mission refers to God’s mission for the churches individually and the churches together in association. The first responsibility of each church is to deal with the same question, “What is God’s mission for us together?”
5. In their setting deals with everything anyone means when he or she says of his or her association, “But I am in a peculiar situation.” Every situation is peculiar, that is, unique; and it is in the uniqueness of that situation that an association of churches has a very special responsibility to be on mission. Associations differ from one another in such ways as size; geographical territory; population; cultural, ethnic, religious, socioeconomic and demographic characteristics of the area; number, strength and types of churches; history; relationship to the state convention; and stage of development.
6. Self-governing - An association is created by the churches and is accountable to those churches through the messengers. An association, like other general bodies of Baptists, (state conventions, Southern Baptist Convention), is self-governing.

A Baptist Association is what the affiliated churches decide to make it. The messengers and executive board members selected by the churches make those basic decisions. The churches decide again what their association will become when they decide what percentage of their church budgets will go to associational missions.

Southern Baptists are committed to Bold Mission Thrust in a general way. You can be a part of what’s happening in a specific way through involvement in your church and association.

**McMinn-Meigs Association of Baptists,
Incorporated**
BY-LAWS

Article I – Existence, Purpose and Relationship

- Section 1:** The McMinn-Meigs Association of Baptists, Inc. exists because Southern Baptist Churches have chosen to join together in fellowship, evangelism and missions.
- Section 2:** The purpose of the McMinn-Meigs Association of Baptists, Inc. is to equip, resource and encourage one another to be faithful Kingdom Servants in obedience to our Lord's Great Commission.
- Section 3:** The McMinn-Meigs Association of Baptists, Inc. shall maintain a cooperative relationship with the Tennessee Baptist Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention in a world mission program.

Article II - Voting Body

- Section 1:** This Association in session shall be composed of messengers duly elected by the Southern Baptist Churches in McMinn and Meigs Counties who are affiliated with this organization. The affiliated churches shall be those that choose or elect to cooperate with the principles and practices of the Association as set out in the Charter of Incorporation and as herein set out.
- Section 2:** Each church shall be entitled to two messengers and one additional messenger for each fifty members or fraction thereof after the first hundred with a maximum of ten messengers from any one church.
- Section 3:** Any church petitioning for membership in the Association shall make such petition through the Credentials Committee. Each church whose petition is approved by the Association shall then be placed under the watch care of the Association for one full year or until the next annual session of the Association. At that time, and providing the church has proven to be in sympathy and in accord with the tenets and practices of the Association, it shall then, by a majority vote of the association messengers present and voting, become a member in full standing. During the year of watch care, the petitioning church shall have a voice but not a vote in Associational affairs, including the representation on the Executive Committee and messengers to the Association.
- Section 4:** As a condition of membership in the Association, member churches shall subscribe to the Articles of Faith as outlined in Article III. In addition, member churches are strongly encouraged to submit an annual church letter that will provide demographic information on the ministry and health of the church and contribute to the financial support of the Association.

A. Articles of Faith

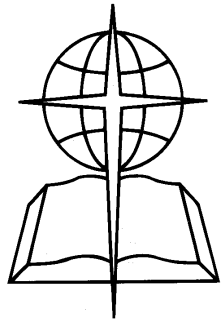
- 1) If any member of the Executive Committee feels that an affiliated church is in violation of any section of the Articles of Faith, said member should follow the guidelines of Matthew 18:15-17.
- 2) Should members of the Executive Committee, representing a minimum of two affiliated churches, believe that an affiliated church is in violation of the Articles of Faith, said members, after having, individually, followed the provisions of sub-Paragraph a of this Paragraph, shall bring the violation to the attention of the Association Officers. The Association Officers shall direct the Credentials Committee to investigate the charges brought against the member church, following these guidelines:
 - a) The Credentials Committee shall contact the church charged with a violation of the Articles of Faith in an effort to confirm the validity of the charges brought against the member church.
 - b) Should the Credentials Committee confirm the validity of the charges, every effort shall be made to lead the church back into conformance with the Articles of Faith and restore the church to fellowship with the Association.
 - c) Should the efforts of the Credentials Committee outlined herein fail to resolve the issue, the Committee shall present a report along with recommendations concerning membership to the Association at the next annual meeting or a special called meeting of the Association called for the expressed purpose of dealing with this issue. No such action shall be taken without at least 14 days written notice to all affiliated churches.
 - d) A recommendation for the loss of membership from the Credentials Committee shall require a two-thirds majority vote of the messengers present and voting at the meeting in which said recommendation is presented.

B. Re-admission

Any church dropped from the rolls, as a result of Section 4, may thereafter petition for re-admission under all the terms and conditions herein above prescribed for admission of churches to membership.

Section 5:

If any member of the Executive Committee feels that fellowship should be withdrawn from any affiliated church for any reason not listed above, said member should follow the guidelines of Matthew 18:15-17. If it is, thereafter, deemed necessary, by the Association Officers, to withdraw fellowship from any church FOR ANY REASON OTHER THAN THOSE SPECIFIED IN SECTION 4, and to refuse to seat its messengers, such action shall be only by a two-thirds majority vote of those messengers present and voting at any annual meeting or special called meeting of the Association called for this expressed purpose, exclusive of the messengers from the said church. No such action shall be taken without at least 14 days written notice to all affiliated churches.

Article III -Articles of Faith

The currently adopted Southern Baptist Convention version of the Baptist Faith and Message shall be the doctrines adopted by this Association.

Article IV - Authority

Section 1: The Association is an autonomous body and therefore reserves the right to determine its own policies and direct its own business; it may refuse to seat messengers who are not in fellowship or doctrinal agreement with the body or if the church by whom they are elected is not.

Section 2: The Association may advise, give counsel, and propose measures to the churches, but shall exercise no power or ecclesiastical jurisdiction over the churches. It shall have power, however, to withdraw fellowship from any church that departs from the doctrines and practices of Baptist Fellowship in accordance with the guidelines of Article II, Section 4.

Section 3: A church shall be considered a Southern Baptist Church in good fellowship with the Association if said church accepts and follows the Baptist Faith and Message referenced in Article III hereof as well as the conditions identified in Section 2 of this Article.

Section 4: Any question concerning fellowship with the churches shall be referred to the Credentials Committee for review in accordance with Article II, Section 4 (A) before presentation to the Association.

Article V – Meetings

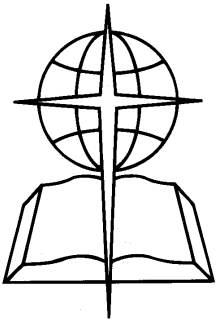
Section 1: The Association shall convene annually in the Fall for the annual business session, unless otherwise fixed by the Association in annual session. The Association may also come together in the spring for an Association Celebration emphasizing Evangelism and Missions in one special event.

Section 2: Special Meetings: The Executive Committee of the Association may call the Association into special session at a time and place set by the committee, with the provision that all affiliated churches must be notified in writing at least 14 days before the special meeting, said notice to give the time, place, and purpose of the meeting.

Section 3: The program for all Meetings shall be planned by the DOM and Association officers with the assistance of an ad hoc committee as necessary.

Article VI - Associational Year

The Associational year shall begin on October first and end on September thirtieth.



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Article VII – Officers

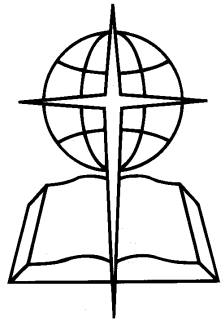
Section 1: The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, an associate moderator, a clerk, a treasurer, and such other officers as may be authorized by the Association. The moderator of the Association shall have the same duties as the president of a corporation is generally understood to have. The moderator and the associate moderator shall not serve for more than one consecutive year, and provided further, that no person shall be eligible for election as moderator until he shall have been a member of the Association for a period of two years. Furthermore, one of the offices, moderator or associate moderator, must be filled by a bi-vocational minister or a layperson. The retiring associate moderator shall be eligible for election to the officer of moderator. The clerk and the treasurer shall be employees of the Association.

Section 2: The officers shall be elected at the annual meeting by majority vote of messengers present and voting, and shall take office at the close of the annual meeting. They shall serve until the close of the next annual meeting of the Association, or until their successors are elected and installed, provided, however, that the retiring clerk shall continue in office as association clerk until the completion and publication of the Associational Minutes and completion of any other duties connected with his/her office for the past associational year.

Article VIII - Executive Committee

Section 1: There shall be an Executive Committee of the Association which shall consist of the following: one lay member elected by each church of the Association from its membership; the Director of Missions, director or chairman of all organizations and committees authorized by the Association; and the pastors of all churches in the Association. The moderator, associate moderator, clerk and treasurer shall be ex-officio members of the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall meet quarterly at the Baptist Center, 350 North Congress Parkway, Athens, Tennessee, or at such other place as may be previously determined. The Annual meeting will serve as the meeting for the fourth quarter of the year of the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall also meet at the call of its chairman. Twenty members of the Committee representing a minimum of 10 member churches shall constitute a quorum necessary to transact business. At its third quarter meeting preceding the Annual Session of the Association, the Executive Committee shall select the director of all organizations which may be authorized by the Association and as nominated by the Nominating Committee. The organizational directors so selected shall take office immediately following the next annual session. However, following the selection by the Executive Committee, the newly selected organizational directors shall be asked to recommend, to the Committee on Committees, the members for their respective committee/organization for the ensuing year.

Section 2: The pastor of any church organized as a result of a mission operated for not less than two years under the sponsorship of a church affiliated with the Association shall be a special member of the Executive Committee, with voice but no vote, until such times as said church shall have an opportunity to apply for and become affiliated with the Association.



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Section 3: The officers of the Association are to be the officers of the Executive Committee, with the moderator of the association serving as chairman. The officers of the Executive Committee shall meet to plan the agenda for each Executive Committee Meeting. This meeting shall occur with sufficient time to notify the members of the Executive Committee of the pending business for the upcoming meeting.

Section 4: The purpose of this Committee shall be to care for every interest of the Association and direct its activities in the interim between the annual meetings and shall carry out the policies and will of the Association as so expressed. The Committee shall have power to fill vacancies, as nominated by the Nominating Committee, among the officers of the Association and the Board of Directors or committees which may occur during the year except representatives to the Executive Committee and may authorize the appointment of any special committee deemed needful to carry out its duties.

Section 5: Nothing outside of or beyond the authority given by the Association to the Executive Committee shall be exercised, unless prior written notice of at least thirty days has been given all of the churches of the Association and the members of the Executive Committee, with the opportunity for any member to present his views to the vote of the Committee.

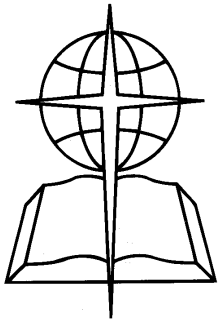
Article IX - Board of Directors

Section 1: The Association shall have a Board of Directors composed of nine members. Six members are to be elected at the annual meeting and serve, along with the moderator, associate moderator and the treasurer, as the Board of Directors. The Director of Missions shall serve as an ex-officio member. The (six) directors are to be elected on a rotating basis, as provided in section 3 of this article.

Section 2: The members of the Board of Directors must be members of churches within the Association, in good standing, and recognized for their knowledge and their loyalty to the programs of the Association.

Section 3: The members of the Board of Directors shall be elected on a rotating basis, provided that in no case shall any person serve on the board longer than three years in succession. The first six members of the Board of Directors shall be elected as follows: two to serve three years; two to serve two years; and two to serve one year, and thereafter two Directors shall be elected at the annual meeting of the McMinn-Meigs Association of Baptists, Inc. to serve three years. Vacancies created by death, resignation or removal from the Associational territory shall be filled at the next annual meeting following the creation of such vacancy by election of a Director to serve the unexpired term. Any person having served on the Board of Directors for a period of three years shall be eligible for re-election after a period of one year.

Section 4: The duty of the Board of Directors shall be to represent the Association in all legal matters and in such other matters as the Association or Executive Board directs, particularly as the real property owned by the Association, protecting the Association, where any process of law is required. Said Board may take such action as to the property holdings of the Association in the interim between the annual meetings, as the Board's discretion may be required or seem necessary or



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advisable, except that said Board may not take any action in direct conflict with the policy or direction of the Association or Executive Committee. The moderator of the Association shall serve as President of the Board.

Article X – Committees and Functional Directors

Section 1: The Association shall also maintain the following Standing Committees and Functional Directors, categorized by function as Administrative, Ministry/Missions/Evangelism and Education/Resources as follows:

- A. **ADMINISTRATIVE:** Committee on Committees, Credentials Committee, Executive Committee, Nominating Committee, Personnel Committee, Property and Grounds Committee, Stewardship Committee and Resolutions/Bylaw Director.
- B. **MINISTRY/MISSIONS/EVANGELISM:** Evangelism Committee, Missions Committee, Christian Builders Director, Prayer Ministry Director and WMU Director.
- C. **EDUCATION/RESOURCES:** Media Library Director, Christian Education Director, VBS Director, Bible Drill Director, Seminary Extension Director and Baptist Collegiate Ministries (BCM) Director.

Section 2: The Committee on Committees shall be composed of three persons. The duties of this Committee shall be to recommend for election, at the following Annual Meeting, the members of the Standing Committees named in Article X, Section 1, with the exception of the Committee on Committees.

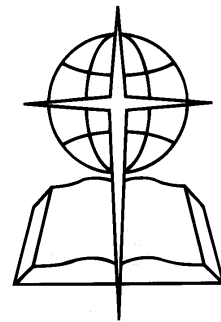
Section 3: Each of said standing committees, with the exception of the Committee on Committees, shall be composed of not less than three but not more than nine members. Members of these committees shall be rotating members and shall be selected from the membership of those churches affiliated with the Association, and shall be subject to reappointment, provided that in no case shall any person serve on the same committee longer than three years in succession, and provided that no person shall serve concurrently on more than two committees, except ex-officio members of all standing committees, including the Committee on Committees.

Article XI – Parliamentary Authority

The parliamentary authority of the McMinn-Meigs Association of Baptists, Inc. shall be the rules contained in the current edition of Roberts Rules of Order newly revised in all matters that are not consistent with these Bylaws and any special rules of order the Association may adopt.

Article XII – Amendments

These By-laws may be amended at any annual meeting, two-thirds of the members present, and voting, concurring providing at least 14 days written notice has been given to the member churches.



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Officer, Organization Director and Committee Procedures

The following is information regarding the officers and standing committees of the McMinn-Meigs Association of Baptists, Inc.:

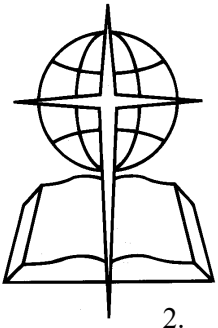
1. Officers are elected on an annual basis and all, except the Moderator and Associate Moderator, may succeed themselves on an annual basis.
2. The Nominating Committee of the Association shall recommend a list of officers and members of the Committee on Committees to the Executive Committee for approval at their third quarterly (July) meeting.
3. All officers and the nominated Committee on Committees shall assume their duties following the next Annual Meeting. However they can, between the Executive Committee July Meeting and the Annual Meeting, recommend, to the Committee on Committees, names of people to serve with them in their area of responsibility.
4. The Nominating Committee shall identify one person for the office of Moderator and one person for the office of Associate Moderator to be recommended for election at the annual meeting. The floor shall be open for additional nominees for the offices of Moderator and/or Associate Moderator, during the annual meeting. The Moderator and Associate Moderator shall assume their duties immediately following the conclusion of the Annual Meeting at which they are elected.
5. The Committee on Committees shall have the responsibility of recommending people to serve on the various standing and special committees of the Association, with the exception of the Executive Committee and the Committee on Committees.
6. Association organizations and committees named herein shall make written and/or verbal reports to the regular meetings of the Executive Committee and the Association Annual Meeting. The Executive Committee shall exercise authority over these organizations and committees only to the extent of determining whether they are working within the bounds of organizational structure of the Association.

Association Officers and Organization Directors

The following is a description of the duties of the Association officers and organization directors. These Officers and directors are grouped according to the major categories of ministry of the Association.

A. ADMINISTRATIVE

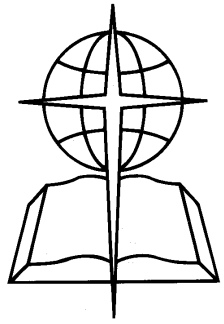
1. **Director of Missions** – The Director of Missions (DoM) is one of five paid employees of the Association (DoM, Secretary, BCM director, camp Director, and Caretaker) and has the responsibility for giving general direction to the paid staff and volunteer leadership of the Association. He is to serve as an ex-officio member of all committees, giving direction as needed and necessary, train the Association leadership in regard to their duties as a committee or organization and help to cast a vision as to the future direction of the Association. A more extensive list of ministry duties can be found in the Job Description Section of the Association Policy Manual.



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2. **Moderator** – The Moderator shall preside at all meetings of the Association and shall serve as ex-officio member of all committees and organizations of the Association. The Moderator shall appoint a parliamentarian at any business meeting where the Bylaws Director is absent, and attend to such other duties as the office may require. The Moderator shall work closely with the Director of Missions in all matters of business and future plans (see Association By-laws Article VIII, Section 1).
3. **Associate Moderator** – The Associate Moderator shall be available to assume the duties of Moderator at any time the Moderator cannot fulfill said duties. He also shall serve as ex-officio member of all committees and organizations of the Association (see Association By-laws Article VIII, Section 1).
4. **Association Clerk/ Financial Secretary/Treasurer** – This person shall be a full-time employee of the association serving under the direct supervision of the Director of Missions. She/he shall be responsible for all duties as assigned and shall also serve as office receptionist. She/he shall also serve as the Association Clerk and be an ex-officio member of the Executive Committee and other organizations and committees as is necessary for her/him to attend. She/he shall be responsible for taking minutes (or making sure someone is present to fulfill that duty) at all Executive Committee meetings and at the Annual Meeting of the Association transcribing and distributing such to the proper persons. She/he is charged with maintaining accurate financial records and reporting. This person shall also serve as ex-officio member of the Stewardship Committee. See Job Descriptions for a more extensive detail of duties.
5. **Camp Cherokee Director** – shall have the responsibility of giving overall direction to the operation of the camp. This person shall keep the Association informed of the needs, schedule and vision for the camp. This person shall work closely with Camp Cherokee Committee in developing a maintenance schedule, usage schedule, fund raising system, and developing a vision for the camp. This person shall work closely with the Director of Missions and other key leaders keeping people informed about the ministry of the camp. This is a paid position (part time).
6. **Resolutions/Bylaws Director** – has the responsibility to oversee the Association Bylaws, proposing amendments as deemed necessary and preparing resolutions for association adoption as appropriate. The Director shall enlist other association members to serve as a committee as necessary for the fulfillment of this responsibility. This individual shall serve as the Association Parliamentarian for all Association meetings.
7. **The Board of Directors** – shall serve as the trustees (legal agents) for the Incorporated Association. This board is composed of nine members, six of which are elected annually on a rotating basis (two elected each year) at the Association Annual meeting. The other three members are the Moderator, Associate Moderator and Treasurer. The Director of Missions shall serve as ex-officio member.
8. **Stewardship Director**—shall be the chairman of the Stewardship Committee and shall give direction to the Association's stewardship of that which is received from our churches and other sources. This person and the committee shall also be available to our churches to help them with any stewardship needs they might have (developing a budget, organizing a stewardship campaign and other stewardship related matters as requested).



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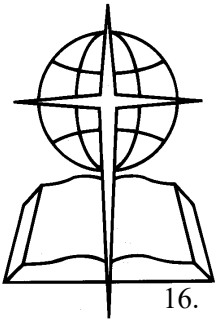
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B. MINISTRY/MISSIONS/EVANGELISM

9. **Evangelism Director** – shall serve as chairman of the Evangelism Committee. Along with the committee this person shall work to keep the Association focused on the main thing, reaching people with the Gospel of Christ. This person and the committee shall encourage our churches, through a variety of means, to be evangelistic in seeking to reach their community and beyond. They shall be available to our churches to assist them in developing ministries that are evangelistic in focus that they might be more effective in their outreach efforts. They shall also be charged with the development and implementation of an annual Association-wide Evangelism Rally.
10. **Missions Director** – shall serve as the chairman of the Missions Committee and shall lead this committee in the responsibility for the development of the mission strategy for the Association.
11. **Woman's Missionary Union (WMU) Director** – shall give general overall direction to the ministry of the WMU of the Association. She shall lead the WMU Council in planning various ministry/mission related events and shall, along with her leaders, be available to our churches to help them develop and/or strengthen their church's WMU ministry. She and her team shall also keep the Association focused on missions through continuous mission education of children and adults. She shall work with the Director of Missions and the Association Missions Committee in casting a continuous mission involvement vision before the Association.
12. **Prayer Ministry Director** – shall, in conjunction with the Association Prayer Council, be responsible for developing an overall ministry of prayer for the Association. Through encouragement and hands on leadership this person is available to our churches to assist them in establishing an ongoing prayer ministry in their church. This person would, when needed, form ad hoc committees to address special prayer needs as they arise.
13. **Christian Builders Director** – shall serve as chairman of the Christian Builders Committee, coordinating the activities and projects of this committee, leading in outreach from our association to individuals and groups where the Christian Builders can minister through the use of their construction skills.

C. EDUCATION/RESOURCES

14. **Media Library Director** – shall be responsible for maintaining and updating the Media/Resource Center at the Association Baptist Center and shall be available to our churches to help them develop and/or strengthen their existing Media ministry.
15. **Christian Education Director** - shall be responsible for keeping our churches informed of the current trends in Sunday School ministry through correspondence, meetings and other means. This person shall also develop a team of leaders that would be available to go to churches to assist them in all areas of Sunday School ministry. Additionally, shall be responsible for keeping our churches informed of the latest trends in the area of Discipleship Training. This person shall also build a team of age group leaders specifically focused on leadership development in the area of Discipleship Training. This person and his/her team of leaders should be available to go to churches to help them develop and/or strengthen their Discipleship ministry. Further, this person shall oversee all areas of continuing education provided in and through the Association.



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16. **Vacation Bible School Director(s)** – shall be responsible for organizing and coordinating the annual Association VBS Training Clinic. The Director(s) shall organize their leadership team and assure they are properly trained for the performance of their duties. The VBS Director(s) shall be available to serve as VBS consultants for the Association churches as requested.
17. **Bible Drill Director** – shall coordinate all events related to the Association Bible Drill Ministry. This person shall set a date, secure a location, contact participating churches, secure judges and callers for the Association event. This person shall do everything possible to get the word about Bible Drill to our churches and encourage them to provide the opportunity for their children and youth to be participants.
18. **Seminary Extension Director** – The Director of Missions shall serve as the Seminary Extension Director. He shall employ a teacher who has the responsibility of teaching two to three classes per year, recruiting students and helping them to set the curriculum for the year. This person is paid a fee per class taught.
19. **Baptist Collegiate Ministries (BCM) Director** – **Baptist Collegiate Ministries (BCM) Director** – receives a small stipend from the Association and shall be responsible for coordinating the ministry of the BCM ministry at Tennessee Wesleyan College in Athens, TN. This individual shall be employed and paid, in addition to the stipend mentioned above, by the Association with funds received from the Tennessee Baptist Convention and will function under the direction and supervision of the Association. Should the funds cease to be provided by the Tennessee Baptist Convention, the position will be terminated.

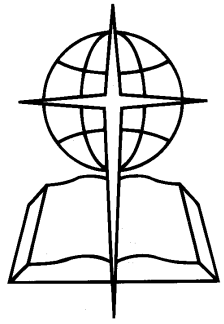
ASSOCIATION COMMITTEES

DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES AND COMMITTEE COMPOSITION

The following is the list of Association Standing Committees and their duties and composition. These Committees are grouped according to the major categories of ministry of the Association.

A. ADMINISTRATIVE

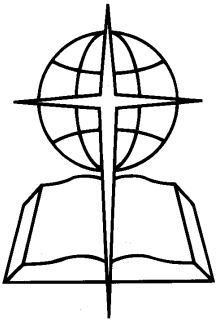
1. **Committee on Committees** – The Committee on Committees shall have the responsibility of recommending people to serve on the various standing and special committees of the Association, with the exception of the Executive Committee. Members of the Committee on Committees shall serve for one year only and may not serve consecutive terms.
2. **Credentials Committee** – shall receive and consider all applications from churches seeking membership in the Association. They shall study carefully the doctrines, practices and organization of each church seeking membership. They shall determine if said churches are in good standing with their sister churches. Their findings shall be conveyed to the Association at its next annual meeting from the time of application. It shall also be the responsibility of this committee to visit and advise any church of the Association which is reported to have departed from the doctrines and practices of the Association as set forth under Article II and III of the By-laws of this Association. Their findings and recommendations shall be reported at the next annual meeting of the Association. This rotating committee shall be composed of three members.



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3. **Executive Committee** – shall consist of the following: one lay member from each member church; the Director of Missions, all organizations directors and committee chairmen and all Pastors of member churches. The Moderator, Associate Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer shall be ex-officio members of the Executive Committee. The committee shall meet quarterly at the Baptist Center, 350 N. Congress Parkway, Athens, Tennessee, or at another location as determined. The annual meeting of the Association shall be considered as the fourth quarter meeting of the Executive Committee. The Moderator has the discretion to call special meetings of the Executive Committee, as needed. Twenty members representing a minimum of 10 churches of the Executive Committee present and voting shall constitute a quorum. The Executive Committee shall be charged with the care of the interests of the Association in the interim between annual meetings. Other duties of the Executive Committee can be found in Article IX Sections 1-5 of the Association By-laws. The following shall be considered the guidelines for the conducting of Association Executive Committee and Annual meetings:
 - 1) A place shall be made on the Order of Business of the Executive Committee and Association Annual Meeting for miscellaneous business.
 - 2) One sermon shall be provided at each Association Annual Meeting
 - 3) The Moderator shall take the chair at the time to which the Association stood adjourned. The Executive Committee and Annual Meetings shall be opened and closed with prayer.
 - 4) The Moderator shall preside over the deliberations of the body, and see that good order is preserved, calling to order if necessary, and reminding members of their duty.
 - 5) Any member wishing to address the Association shall rise in his/her place, and address the Moderator. If more than one seems to address him at one time, he shall name the member to occupy the floor.
 - 6) The Moderator shall decide points of order, subject to an appeal from his decision to the Association. He shall have the preference to speak or explain when an appeal is taken from his decision.
 - 7) Any member may call for a point of order, and the member so-called shall take his seat until the one who made the call shall have time to make their point clear and distinct, and then shall be open for debates and explanations. No person shall speak more than once to any point of order except by leave of the association.
 - 8) The Moderator may name any member to fill the chair, but such substitutions shall not extend beyond adjournment; no motion shall claim his attention unless it is seconded, or shall be open for discussion until formally announced by him.
 - 9) The order of business of the Association shall be such as shall be adopted from time to time by the Association, and shall be subject to change or amendment at the pleasure of the Association.
4. **Nominating Committee** - Shall present, at the July meeting of the Executive Committee, nominations for the Board of Directors and Association officers (see Association Bylaws, Article IX, Section 1) and the Committee on Committees. This committee shall also



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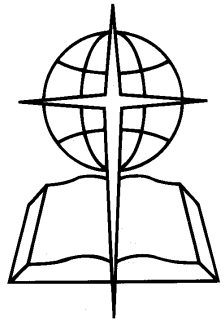
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present, at the annual meeting, one nomination for the position of Moderator and one nomination for the position of Associate Moderator for election at the annual meeting. This rotating committee shall be composed of three members.

5. **Personnel Committee** – shall recommend staff personnel to fill vacancies occurring during the Association year, and recommend a person or persons to be added to the present staff, at such time as the Association may direct additional personnel to be employed. The committee shall have the power to recommend salaries, define vacations, hear grievances, act on fringe benefits, accept resignations and define the duties of employees. This rotating committee shall be composed of three members.
6. **Property and Grounds Committee** – shall be responsible for maintaining in good repair all equipment, buildings and properties of the Association, except Camp Cherokee, which shall be under the supervision of the Camp Cherokee Committee. This rotating committee shall be composed of three members.
7. **Stewardship Committee** – shall prepare annually a proposed budget for the Association and present such to the annual meeting for adoption. They shall be available to our churches to help them develop methods of supporting the budget. They shall consider all matters of finances referred to it by the Association, Board of Directors and the Executive Committee. They shall also give general supervision to the entire Association finance program, including current operational expenses, financial obligations assumed by the Association and planning and direction in regard to all capital needs and capital investments of the Association. The Treasurer shall be an ex-officio member of this committee. They shall be responsible for auditing all financial records of the Association and obtaining periodic independent audits. This rotating committee shall be composed of six members with the Stewardship Director serving as chairman.

B. MINISTRY/MISSIONS/EVANGELISM

8. **Evangelism Committee** – shall be charged with the responsibility of motivating and encouraging our churches in the area of evangelism. This is done by providing opportunities for our churches to learn of new methods in the area of evangelistic outreach, providing training sessions, organizing and conducting an annual evangelism conference, crusades and encouraging churches to reach new people and bring them into the church through baptism. This rotating committee shall be composed of three members with the Evangelism Director serving as Chairman.
9. **Missions Committee** – shall have the responsibility for the development of the mission strategy for the Association. They shall look at the various needs that exist in the area and develop ministries to meet those needs. They shall also focus on other mission opportunities outside the Association determining the direction the Association will take in the area of International and North American mission volunteerism. Determine the local ministries that the Association needs to develop or support and lead our churches and individuals to be involved. Determine methods that can be used to support and encourage continuing mission education in our churches. This rotating committee shall be composed of six-nine members with the Director of Missions, Moderator, Associate Moderator, and WMU Director serving as ex-officio members.
10. **Christian Builders Committee** – shall have the responsibility to answer the call of individuals and groups where the Christian Builders can minister through the use of their



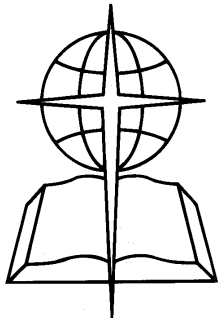
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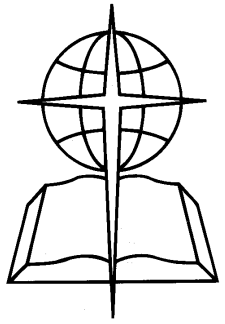
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construction skills. This committee shall consist of six to nine members recommended by the Christian Builders Director who shall serve as Chairman of this committee.

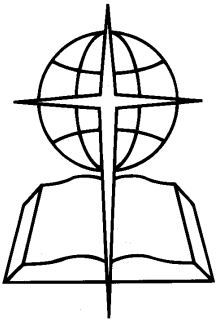
C. EDUCATION/RESOURCES

They shall also be available to assist our churches in the development of or strengthening of their Media/Library Centers and to set Association wide training programs as needed during the course of a given year. This non-rotating committee shall be composed of three members with the Media/Library Director serving as chairman.



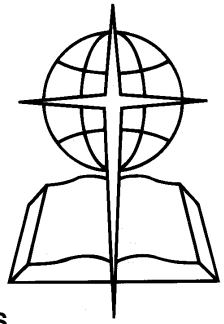


Annual Church Profiles 2025



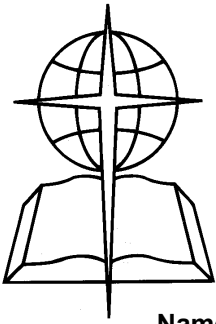
